DAY 2: FRIDY, 25TH AUGUST, 2023

PLENARY SESSIONN II

MORNING DEVOTION

Rev. Daniel Lankai Lawson led the morning devotion. PH 20:1-3 was sung after t, after which he led us into prayers. Col. 1:17, 2 Cor. 3:8 and Acts 7:55 were all read.

He emphasized on the theme: "Christ In you, the Hope of glory", and dwelled on a sub theme: "What is in you?" He mentioned that what is in us is what we transfer to others, citing Paul's genuine faith as an example. He continued that in Acts 3:6, Peter gave what was in him. He challenged delegates to give more than they have through Christ. He stressed that we can do so by giving hope to the hopeless. He encouraged members to learn how to progress in the face of opposition.

He read Jonah 1:5 and Matt. 8:24. He linked the two stories that both were facing a difficulty but as Jonah was thrown out, Jesus calmed the storm. In the other case: who is in our boat? Christ or Jonah

He entreated delegates to pursue Christ and fruitfulness, and always serve first the kingdom of God. He then prayed and sung PH 4 stanzas 1&2. He then thanked the leadership of the fellowship for the opportunity to lead after which we shared the grace.

CHAIRPERSON'S RESPONSE

The Chairman thanked the leaders of the Fellowship

He stated that YAF was formed to fulfill a reason and back home we must advice and encourage our members to take active role in church activities. He encouraged YAF members to spend their time doing the Lord's work.

He emphasized that the only people the church can rely on is YAF. On this note, he accepted to chair the program

The National President presented his address (refer to Appendix c of the 16th National Assembly Brochure).

He then moved for workshop group discussion and was seconded by Bro. Mark Harry Ossom Odjawo- Central President.

BRIEF ADDRESS BY REV. BOSSMAN OHENE

The House sung PH 311 (1-4)

THE Director, Church Life and Nurture (CLAN), Rev. Bossman Ohene addressed the house. He acknowledged the National Officers and all other protocols present and expressed his palpable joy for the opportunity given him to address Assembly.

He commented on the Moderator's absence as it's due to an emergency and promised the moderator together with Moderator elect will be with the Assembly the next day with their own greetings.

He applauded the National President for his exeges is on the word of God during his address.

He reflected on the theme "Christ in you, the Hope of Glory: Abiding in Christ as a Young Adult.

He stated that the Colossians did not set Christ as their all and were having doubts in their minds, and that made Paul, even in all his settings do his best to preach to them that Christ is all of what they do.

HOW TO ABIDE IN CHRIST

1. To abide in Christ means to be connected to Christ. He asked whether we are connected with Christ.

- 2. Abiding in Christ means depending on Christ. Irrespective of the situation we find ourselves; we must depend solely on Christ
- 3. Abiding in Christ means to remain in Christ. Challenges make us forget Christ but as believers we must remain in Christ to see His Glory.

He encouraged the house never to throw God away in any moments of their lives as even at the last-minute God can still work out things for us.

He ended with Luke 7:11 and emphasized that just as the dead was resurrected by Christ; all our problems would be solved by this same Christ. He said words of blessings to the fellowship.

He stated that men's fellowship is having its National Conference in Sunyani but still sees the need to visit YAF. He added that, YAF is the Pillar and the source of light for the church today. He encouraged YAF to come out with the purpose of the church. He ended with a presentation of an undisclosed amount.
